## **Attention Parents of Barker Juniors:**

# Barker High School will be offering an SAT Prep Course to prepare for the May 4, 2019 SAT exam

The purpose of this course is to familiarize juniors with the format, style, and content of SAT questions they will encounter on the SAT exams, as well as a thorough instruction in test taking strategies. It is designed and scheduled to prepare the students for the May 4, 2019 SAT exam and/or the exam on June 1, 2019.

The course will be taught by Mr. Barry Jones who has over 25 years of experience in SAT tutoring, both individually and in group classes with several local school districts. Mr. Jones is a dually certified teacher of math and social studies, with over 40 years of teaching experience and a Master's Degree in Education. He was Math Department Head at Lyndonville Central School for over 30 years before he retired, and has been a part-time faculty member in the math department at The College at Brockport since 1981, where he continues to teach. His business, JonesGroup Services, has also offered individual tutoring in SAT skills, mathematics tutoring, consultation services for school districts, and teacher workshops in Mathematics for the last 25 years.

The course will prepare students for the SAT Exam in the new aspects of the test: Mathematics, Critical Reading, and Writing (Essay now optional) by offering varied instructional techniques and practices, and will include in-class simulations, practice exercises done at home and reviewed in class, as well as alternative solutions to problems that will prepare the students for the types of exam questions they will see on the SAT exams. Since the SAT exam is unlike any test the students have taken before and covers all high school topics in mathematics, English and reading, and essay writing, it is strongly advised that a college bound student have adequate practice before taking the exam. That is the purpose of this course.

The course will consist of 5 SAT preparation classes of 3 hours to enable the student to take the May 4<sup>th</sup> exam and retake if they choose in June. It is an advantage to take at least two exams if possible, since the highest scores will count and new earlier financial aid dates and universal application dates have moved up for many college schedules next fall. This gives students a better chance for a higher score by the end of their junior year, with retakes possible early in their senior year.
