

March 6th: Cat Day Dress like Cat in the Hat or wear red and black!



All changes regarding bus changes, early dismissals, 10th period activities, Elementary Musical, Band and Chorus, must be entered in PickUp Patrol. Changes may be made in advance.

If there is no change entered for a child in PickUp Patrol, their "Default" plan will be utilized, and they will be sent home on the 2:28 bus.

The cutoff time for changes is 1:00, we will not accept changes after this time.

We will **no longer** be accepting paper notes, phone calls or emails.

We will only accept phone call changes in an extreme emergency.

To Pratt Elementary Parents:

This letter is to inform parents of another change to our elementary student drop-off procedure in the morning. These changes affect those parents who elect to drive their children to school instead of sending them on the bus.

We understand that some parents want to walk their children directly to the door of the school to ensure their young children are taken into the care of our faculty members. However, this is causing safety concerns in the district office parking lot.

To address this, we will have several of our teacher aides posted at the drop off point at the district office lot. Parents, please allow these staff members to take your children directly from the drop off spot to their classrooms.

This process will have our young students go directly from their car to our teacher aides, and then right to their classrooms.

This process will begin on Thursday February 2. Teacher aides will be available to escort your child from between 7:45 and 7:55 am. Parents, please just let one of the aides know if you would like your child escorted. Otherwise, students can just walk right to class.

We know that our drop off plan in the morning have gone through several changes, and we thank you for your patience and flexibility.

Way to go Tessa!


