The first is our current staffing. As many of you know, the district is still in the process of hiring a full-time science teacher for grades 7 and 8. When we officially hire a new science teacher, these courses will transition to that teacher.

We are excited to welcome both teachers to our faculty. Please note that students in the high school will likely receive new, updated schedules with this information next week.

In terms of instruction beginning next week, those students in cohorts 2 and 3 should log on to their teachers' Google classroom Tuesday morning. Directions with how to do this have been previously posted to the main district website under announcements.
