

Niagara County Department of Health Flow Chart for Symptomatic Individuals in PK-12 Schools

Student, Teacher or Staff member with <u>NO</u> <u>Known Exposure</u> has a temperature >100° OR exhibits new or unusual symptoms of COVID-19:

Fever, chills • Shortness of breath • Sore throat • Loss of taste or smell • Headache • Loss of appetite • Cough • Nasal congestion or runny nose • Nausea, vomiting or diarrhea • Fatigue • Muscle or body aches



REGARDLESS of vaccination status, individual must stay or return home. Contact health care provider for alternate diagnosis.



Alternate diagnosis

Individual may return to school with a note signed by their health care provider explaining the alternate diagnosis.



COVID-19 test result is negative **:

Individuals may return to school if symptoms are improving, and they are feverfree for 24 hours without fever reducing medication.

They must provide a copy of the negative test result or a note from their health care provider indicating the negative result.



COVID-19 test result is positive^{\$}:

Individual required to self-isolate under Public Director's Standing Order for Isolation

Individual can return to school after <u>self-release</u> from Isolation



No test/No alternate diagnosis:

Individual may return to school after at least 5 days have passed since date of first symptoms

AND Individual's symptoms are improving

AND Individual is fever-free for at least 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medicines.

It is school responsibility to follow-up/monitor these individuals

\$ PCR, Rapid Antigen (including At-Home) tests are acceptable REGARDLESS of vaccination status.
