Dear Families,

We are beginning Prekindergarten registration for the 2022-2023 school year. Our program serves students who will be 4 years of age by December 1, 2022. Those wishing to register a child are asked to contact the Central Registrar (info below) for a PreK registration packet. This information can also be printed from the Barker CSD website. Once you have returned and submitted the packet in full with all attached documentation, the school registrar will contact you to finalize registration.

Also, for next year we will be running a full day session as well as two half day sessions. We are also opening this program up to non-Barker residents at no charge. However, Barker residents do have first priority with placement. Non-residents will also have to transport their child themselves. The full day program will allow our students to take part in things such as physical education and other specials, lunch, and experience a full day of instruction and school. More information is below.

Applications will not be labeled as "submitted" until all paperwork is completed in its entirety and all required documentation has been attached. All fully completed student registrations are due by <u>June 1, 2022</u>. If the district receives more completed registrations than we have spots available, a lottery will be held. The details and time/location of the lottery will be made available to families who applied.

As stated above, we have two options for PreK programming for the 2022-2023 school year:

- 1. Half day session. AM will run from 7:50 10:30. PM session will run from 11:55 2:28.
- 2. Full Day session, which runs from 7:50 2:28 pm.
- 3. Busing is available to all Barker resident students.
- Please indicate your preference on the accompanying letter. This is not a guarantee of placement.

The following documents are required for consideration to the program. The registration packet must be completed and submitted to the Central Registrar.

- Health form
- Home Language Questionnaire

- Birth Certificate or Proof of age
- Proof of Residency (1)

- Immunization Record

- Custody paperwork, if applicable

Families will also have to bring their child in for **PreK screening on August 23 or 24**. Our Central Registrar will set up the time with you.


