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Behavior/Expectations:

In order to be successful in the classroom this school year, you need to do the following:

- 1. Come PREPARED to class!
- 2. Focus and complete notes in class.
- 3. PARTICIPATE in class discussions.
- 4. Complete assignments on time!
- 5. Study for tests and quizzes.

Consequences for behavior-

- 1. Warning
- 2. Detention (either lunch or after school depending on severity)
- 3. Discuss problem with Team Teachers, parents, and/or principal

Course description:

This year we will mostly focus on ancient civilizations and how they impacted the development of the world. Some of the civilizations we will discuss this year include Mesopotamia, Egypt, China, Greece, and Rome. We will discuss government types, customs and traditions, and how world religions played a role in the development of civilizations. Our year will end with discussion on the Middle Ages.

Grading:

<u>Assignments (25%)</u>- Homework assignments provide exposure to the topic we are studying. These assignments may include vocabulary or completing a worksheet. Assignments are due at the <u>beginning</u> of class the day it is due, unless otherwise noted. Assignments are given a check mark for completion or given as a homework grade. Graded assignments are 20 points off per day late (3 days maximum).

<u>Current Events (15%)</u>- Students will be required to complete three current event assignments each marking period. The assignment is designed to provide students a glimpse of what is going on around the world and how it impacts the way they live. The assignment will be assigned on Monday and are due at the beginning of class on Friday the same week. <u>THESE ASSIGNMENTS</u> WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED LATE UNLESS ABSENT OR ANOTHER ACCEPTABLE REASON!

<u>Tests and Quizzes (40%)</u>- Tests are given at the end of a chapter and quizzes the weeks in between. A test counts two times as much as a quiz. Students will receive their test back and make corrections in class (students will receive this information after first test). The original test score and correction score will each count one time. Bonus points only count on original test grade. <u>Test corrections need to be turned in at the beginning of class to receive credit.</u> All tests are collected and handed out for final exam review.

Example 1-

- Test grade: 98 (including 5 bonus points)
- Correction grade: 93 (student chose not to complete corrections)

Example 2-

- Test grade: 84
- Correction grade: 92 (student made all corrections correctly)

Notebooks (10%) are for your benefit and need to stay organized. Notebooks are collected and graded twice each marking period. Mr. Norris will announce a folder check a few days before.

<u>Preparation/Participation (10%)</u>- is just that: you need to be prepared to learn for class (with a pencil, paper, textbook, notebook) to be able to participate in class activities. Each day unprepared will result in a 10-point deduction.

I expect you to put forth your best effort at all times. I will continue to expect the best out of everyone. One of the key character words used in class will be <u>responsibility</u>. You are responsible for all of your work and decisions that you make.
